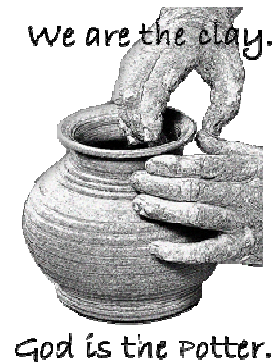

A WORD FROM WALT

Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work ...
 James 1:2-4

Last Sunday night I mentioned that someone in the Brentwood Hills family had recently reminded me that this congregation – and this would be true of any congregation – is filled with people who are experiencing trials, pain and troubles. The old saying is still true – “Preach to broken hearts because there is one on every pew.”

We used that reminder to begin a two-week discussion of the familiar opening verses in James. Let's remember several of these important truths ...

“Consider” is an accounting term – used to determine whether something is an asset or a liability. How do we evaluate our trials, pain and troubles? Do we typically view them as liabilities? God inspires James to assure us that they can be valuable assets!

“Whenever” not “if ever” is the way James describes the reality of the troubles we experience. Trials are not optional nor are they limited to those living in disobedience to God. In fact, trials are inevitable – even to those in close fellowship with the Lord. We don't need to be surprised by these experiences, but we will be wise to learn how to benefit from what God wants to use them to accomplish in our lives.

“Testing of your faith” gets to the heart of what God really wants to do in our lives. So frequently, we are inclined to put our faith in anything but God – faith in our jobs, our relationships, our health, our skills, etc. etc. However, faith in God is the only thing that can sustain us.

“Perseverance must finish its work” is a challenge to all of us because when we're facing trials, it's very easy to be impatient. None of us likes to hurt, and when we do, we want it to get over with yesterday! But God is in the process of developing a masterpiece on the canvas of our lives (Ephesians 2:10), and as someone has said, even though we may not like the discomfort of the 'brush strokes on the canvas of our lives' we can't impatiently 'jump off the easel.'

As Dana went on in her email, "How often do we look in a mirror and see our reflection or our flaws without stopping to think about trying to see God's reflection or even realize that we are called to reflect God?" II Corinthians 3: 18 "...we...are being transformed into His likeness..."

In October, we will all have an opportunity to attend the Family Retreat---October 2-4 at Henry Horton State Park. Our theme this year will be "Shape-up"! We plan to spend some time looking at a lot of areas in our life that we need to "Shape-up"---to have God re-shape or re-mold as we BECOME the person God wants us to be!

Dana went on to share with me that she now has a new thought posted in her kitchen, "Be mindful of whose image you reflect". A great thought for our Journey this week...whose image do we reflect? ---in our words, our deeds, our thoughts, our dress, our actions and the list goes on and on! "Your attitude should be the same as that of Jesus Christ." Philippians 2:5

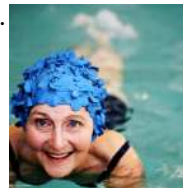


END-OF-SUMMER TRIP
